ACADEMICS 2015

2015 Matriculants refuse to be cropped out off 100% record!







The intense and stressful wait is over! Randfontein High School has procured a 100% matric pass rate once again with hard work, determination and the inception of the paper-less system, RHS has obtained stupendous achievements including 133 distinctions and 70% bachelors pass rate. Furthermore RHS achieved distinctions in the following subjects: Mathematics - 11, Mathematical Literacy - 12, Life Sciences - 12, Physical Sciences - 6, Afrikaans FAL - 7, English HL - 1, Life Orientation - 66, Accounting - 2, Business Studies - 2, Design - 1, Dramatic Arts - 8, Engineering Graphics & Design - 2, Geography - 3 and Tourism - 1.

If you happened to watch the Matric Results Announcement on SABC 1 on 5 January 2016 at 18:30, you would have learnt that the top-performing pupil for matric 2015 is Andrew Tucker of Western Cape's SA College High School. Now let us see which RHSian will step up to the plate to seize that title this year. Are you ready for the challenge?

Owing to the higher standard of the final exams and many rumours of cheating in the examination rooms in other provinces, it was uncertain whether RHS would still be holding up the burning flame of our prestigious school record. However, due to our hard-working educators in conjunction with our matriculants burning the midnight oil, RHS was able to soar in triumph.

The existence of our 100% matric pass rate has been sustained for eight years. Now the ball is in your court and it is up to you to strive for another 8 years of excellence - another 8 years of unrelenting lion victory!

On a national level, it was ascertained that the top three provinces in South Africa were Western Cape with 84,7%, Gauteng 84,2% and Freestate with 81,6%. The national matric pass rate for 2014 was 75,8%. This past year (2015) has decreased by 5,1% landing on 70,7%. It is unfortunate that Eastern Cape was the worst performing province with 56,8% as stated by the Department of Basic Education.







#RHS Infrastructure

We have always been very proud of our facilities. They create an environment conducive to learning and teaching and where learners have a home away from home. Our classrooms and other teaching spaces are welcoming and special and add a positive character to teaching. Unfortunately they are more than 50 years old and insufficient for the growth in learner numbers. We have been requesting assistance from the Department of Education in this regard, for more than 19 years and...

At last it is ready, steady, go... as the long awaited capital upgrade of our reality.

The full project was approved and the contractor appointed in November 2015. The estimated time for completion of this project is 7 to 8 months. Airconditioning in classes, improved ablution facilities, new roofs, downpipes, ceilings, electrical upgrade throughout the school, infra-structure grades, a new Tuck Shop, brand new flooring and palisade fencing (1,4 km) which will contribute to your safety are only a few of the projects that will be addressed by this project.

During this period there will be certain areas of the school that will be out of bounds to learners as it is imperative, for your safety, that you do not enter these areas until all work has

been completed by the contractor and the chevron tape removed.

How do you qualify for a Laureate Award?

"The Laureate Blazer "

The Laureate blazer is black with a silver crest. A black tie with a silver crest will also be presented to the recipient of the laureate blazer. No colours scrolls to be worn on the blazer. A black Laureate pullover may be worn with the blazer. The blazer to be symbolically presented to the recipient at an awards ceremony. The SMT of the school have the right to remove the blazer should a learner's bad behaviour warrant this. The Laureate blazer may be worn for ONE year only and, subsequently, only on condition that a learner qualifies in the following year/s. Should a learner achieve more than one Laureate award, a silver braiding will be added to the existing Laureate blazer.

Academics

A learner with an average of 85%+ in Grade 10 - 12 and 90%+ in Grade 8 - 9, at the end of an academic year, will qualify to wear the Laureate blazer.

Cultural

A Laureate blazer will be awarded for at least 4 Full Colours – of which one full colour must be obtained through National Participation – in one calendar year (may be accumulated from more than one discipline e.g. sports, cultural or academics)

Sport

A Laureate blazer will be awarded to a sports learner who is selected for a provincial team participating on national level."






